

## **PARTICIPATION IN CONFERENCE SESSIONS AND WORKSHOPS**

There are three ways for conference participants to present their work at this conference.

### **1. Parallel Research Sessions**

These parallel sessions will last 70 minutes.

Each session will consist of two or three theory, research or practically oriented presentations inspired by one of the seven themes of the conference, or by the general conference title: Family Resemblances. Each individual presentation will last no more than half its allotted time (usually, around 15-18 minutes), followed by a question-and-answer period.

The appointed chair of each session has the responsibility to act as time-keeper, ensuring each presentation receives its allotted time, as well as where necessary acting as guide for the dialogue in each session. Papers must be in English or Spanish

### **2. Exhibition poster or Kiosk**

Poster or kiosk displays inspired by any of the seven themes of the conference.

The full poster or kiosk display must be set up on the first day of the conference, prior to the first session. The exhibition will remain in place throughout the conference for participant viewing and sharing.

### **3. Workshops**

Community of philosophical inquiry workshop sessions will last 90 minutes.

Participants guiding a session will have up to 60 minutes to guide a community of philosophical inquiry, including the philosophical dialogue. This will be followed by 25 minutes open discussion about the methodological aspects and the philosophical content of the dialogue. The discussion element will be chaired by an appointed chair.

## **Making Submissions for Parallel Session, Exhibition Poster or Workshops**

Applications are now open for proposals to present at these sessions.

In order to be considered for the program, individual paper proposals must be received no later than September 30th, 2016. They should include the following information:

1. Name of presenter
2. Institutional affiliation
3. Address and email
4. Title of the presentation, whether it is for consideration for a Parallel Session or Exhibition poster or if for a Workshop session, the topic of the workshop.
5. 1500 word executive summary of paper (Parallel Session and Exhibition poster) or basic characteristic of the specific style of philosophical dialogue (workshops)
6. Half A4 page CV.
7. Please state what, if any, audio-visual technology will be required for your paper.

Papers will be reviewed by the scientific committee of the conference. Two members of that committee will independently evaluate the proposals (blind review) and make a well-reasoned decision regarding the admission or rejection of the proposal. The Program Committee will finalize decisions no later than November 15th 2017.

Proposals should be gathered into a single Word/Text document and uploaded through the link below

Those who have had their proposals accepted must send the first full draft of their paper or poster before **May 15th 2017**. These documents, gathered into a single Word/Text document, should be uploaded through the link below so all those attending the conference can read them before the Conference. After the Conference, authors will have time to introduce changes in their text, taking into account feedback received in their presentation.

It is intended that parallel papers will be published in a collected volume following the conference. The final text for publication must be sent to the Organizing Committee before September 30th 2017.
